Uses:

1. Completed Actions in the Past:

She visited her grandmother last weekend.

This indicates that the visit started and finished in the past.

2. Series of Completed Actions:

He woke up, brushed his teeth, and left for work.

This shows a sequence of actions that happened one after another.

3. Specific Time in the Past:

I saw the movie last night.

The action of seeing the movie happened at a specific time.

4. Duration in the Past (often with for, during, etc.):

He lived in Paris for five years.

This indicates that he stayed in Paris for a specific duration in the past.

5. Habits in the Past:

When I was a child, I played outside every day.

This shows a repeated action that was a habit in the past.



• Often, the past simple tense is used with time expressions like: yesterday, last week, last year, in 2010, when, then, etc.

Past Continuous



Uses:

1. Ongoing Action in the Past:

At 8 PM last night, I was watching TV."

This shows an action that was in progress at a specific time in the past.

2. Interrupted Actions:

I was reading a book when she called.

This indicates that the reading was ongoing and was interrupted by the phone call.

3. Parallel Actions:

While she was cooking, he was cleaning.

This shows two actions happening at the same time.

4. Background Information:



The sun was shining, and the birds were singing."

This sets the scene by describing ongoing background actions.

5. Repeated Actions with Irritation:

He was always talking during the meetings."

This indicates a repeated action in the past, often with a sense of irritation.

Signal Words:

• Commonly used with time expressions such as: while, when, as, at that moment, all day, all night, etc.

Comparison:

Past Simple vs. Past Continuous:

- Focus on Completion vs. Progress:
 - **Past Simple:** Focuses on the completion of an action.
 - Example: "I finished my homework."
 - Past Continuous: Focuses on the ongoing nature or progress of an action.
 - Example: "I was finishing my homework when you called."
- Specific Time vs. Background:
 - **Past Simple:** Indicates a specific moment or series of actions.
 - **Example:** "He left the party early."
 - **Past Continuous:** Often provides the background context for another action.
 - Example: "He was leaving the party when it started to rain."
- Interrupted Actions:
 - **Example Combined:** "I was having dinner (past continuous) when the phone rang (past simple)."



The ongoing action (having dinner) is interrupted by another action (phone rang).



Example:
